

Terms and conditions

Acceptance of any contribution, gift or grant is at the discretion of the Oxfam South Africa. The Oxfam South Africa will not accept any gift unless it can be used or expended consistently with the purpose and mission of the Oxfam South Africa.

No irrevocable gift, whether outright or life-income in character, will be accepted if under any reasonable set of circumstances the gift would jeopardize the donor's financial security.

The Oxfam South Africa will refrain from providing advice about the tax or other treatment of gifts and will encourage donors to seek guidance from their own professional advisers to assist them in the process of making their donation.

The Oxfam South Africa will accept donations of cash or publicly traded securities. Gifts of in-kind services will be accepted at the discretion of the Oxfam South Africa.

Certain other gifts, real property, personal property, in-kind gifts, non-liquid securities, and contributions whose sources are not transparent or whose use is restricted in some manner, must be reviewed prior to acceptance due to the special obligations raised or liabilities they may pose for Oxfam South Africa.

The Oxfam South Africa will provide acknowledgments to donors meeting tax requirements for property received by the charity as a gift. However, except for gifts of cash and publicly traded securities, no value shall be ascribed to any receipt or other form of substantiation of a gift received by Oxfam South Africa.

The Oxfam South Africa will respect the intent of the donor relating to gifts for restricted purposes and those relating to the desire to remain anonymous. With respect to anonymous gifts, the Oxfam South Africa will restrict information about the donor to only those staff members with a need to know.

The Oxfam South Africa will not compensate, whether through commissions, finders' fees, or other means, any third party for directing a gift or a donor to the Oxfam South Africa.
